

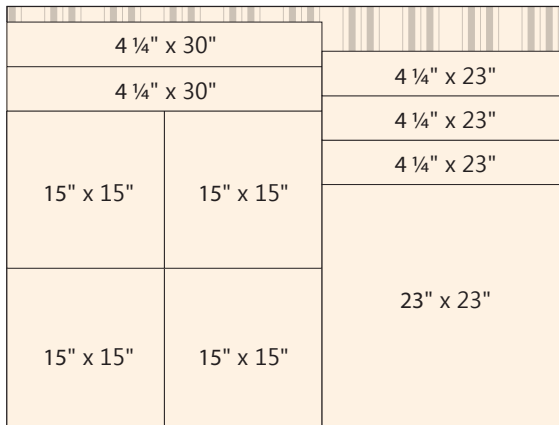
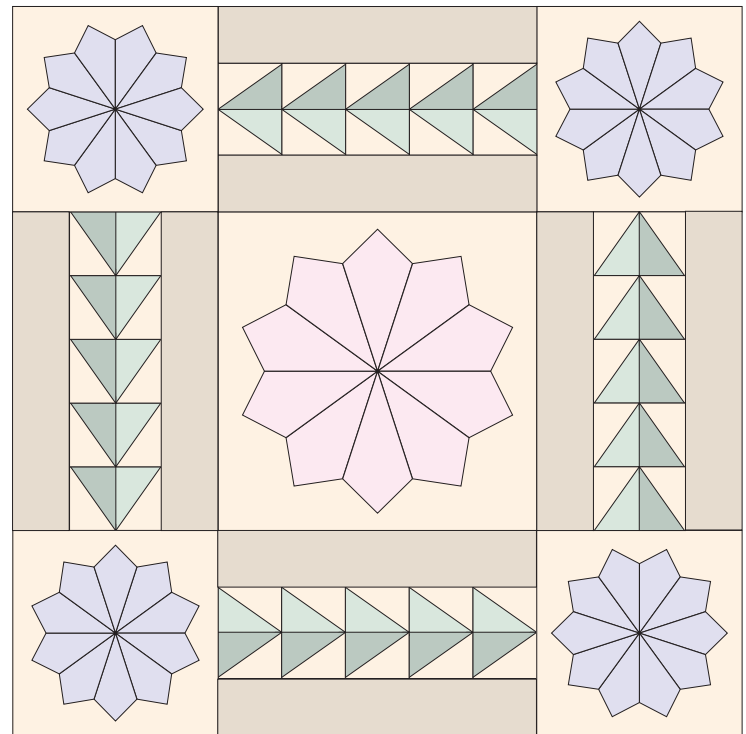
Dresden Gem

For the Dresden Ten you need the standard Gem Ten and Gem Five tools. The Gem Junior is optional.

Finish size: 52" x 52"

A	1 ½ yds*	One 23" x 23"
		Four 15" x 15"
		**Two 4 ¼" x 30"
		**Three 4 ¼" x 23"
B	¾ yd	Eight 4 ½" x 23"
C	¾ yd	Two 10 ¾" x width
D	¾ yd	Five 7" x 27"
E	¼ yd	Two 4 ¼" x width
F	¼ yd	Two 4 ¼" x width

*Add additional yardage for directional fabrics

Cutting Diagram Fabric A

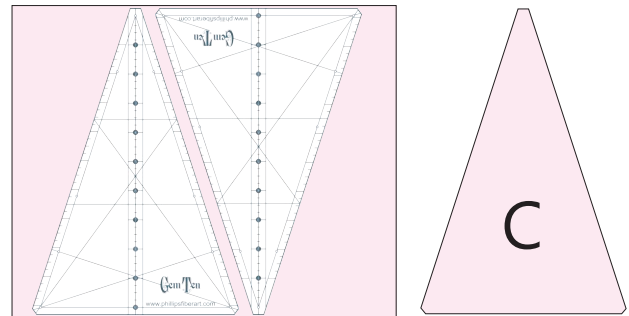
Note: Use this cutting diagram to make the most of your fabric. For directional fabric add an additional ½ yd and cut three 4 ¼" strips.

Tool Preparation

Prepare your Gem Ten and Gem Five tools by attaching either True Grips™ adhesive rings or loops of clear packaging tape to the tools.

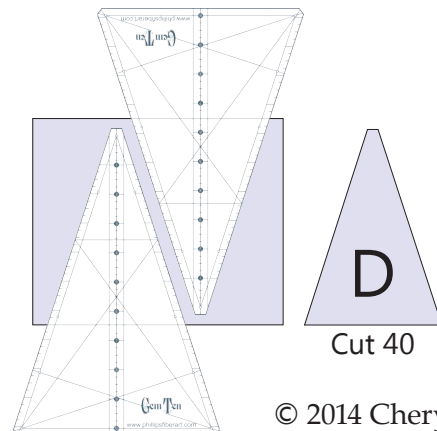
Cutting

- Cut Strips as listed.
- Cut *ten* of C using the Gem Ten tool.



Cut 10

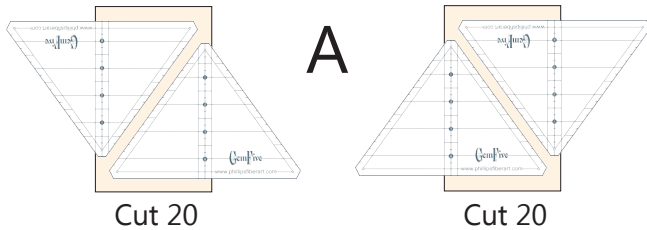
- Cut *forty* of D using the Gem Ten tool on the 6 ½" line or the full sized Gem Junior tool.



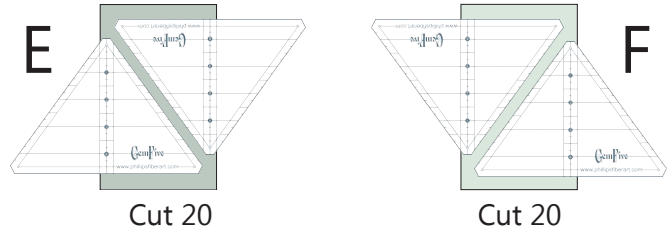
Cut 40

Cutting Continued

- Place the Gem Five tool onto the A fabric, aligning the 1/4" line to the edge of the fabric as shown. Note: this adds the necessary seam allowance.
- Cut *twenty* of A using the Gem Five tool.
- Cut twenty of A using the other side of the Gem Five tool.

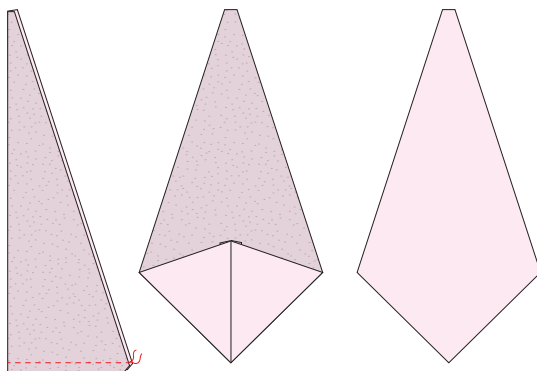


- Place the Gem Five tool onto the A fabric, aligning the 1/4" line to the edge of the fabric as shown. Note: this adds the necessary seam allowance.
- Cut *twenty* of E using the Gem Five tool.
- Cut *twenty* of F using the other side of the Gem Five tool.



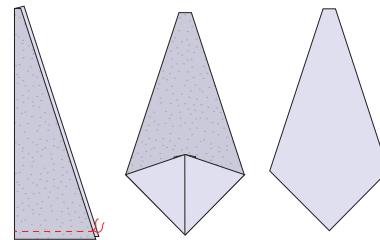
Sewing the Large Dresden

- Fold the C piece in half.
- Sew along the bottom using 1/4" seam allowances.
- Turn the point and press open, center the seam.
- Repeat for all *ten* pieces.



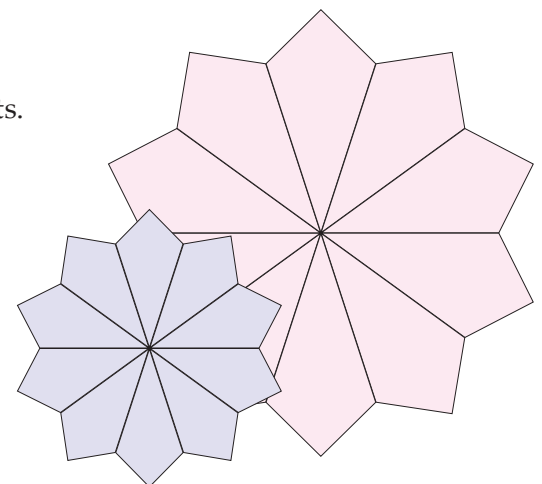
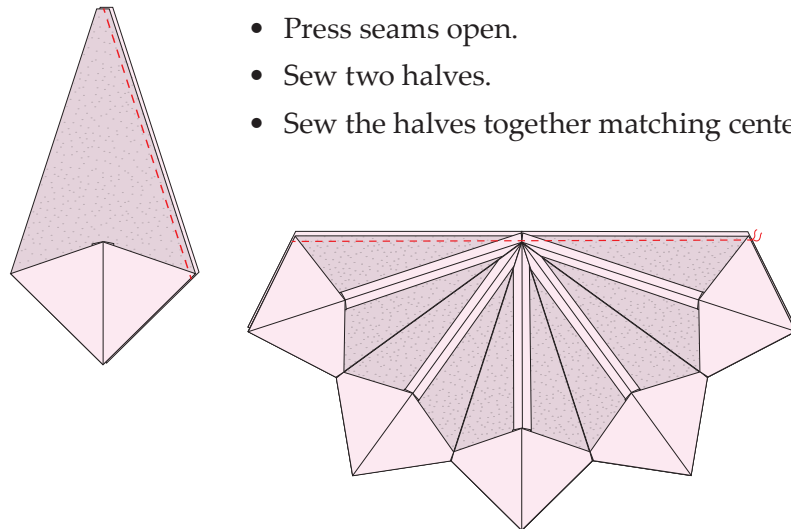
Sewing the Small Dresden

- Fold the D piece in half.
- Sew along the bottom using 1/4" seam allowances.
- Turn the point and press open, center the seam. Repeat for all *forty* pieces.



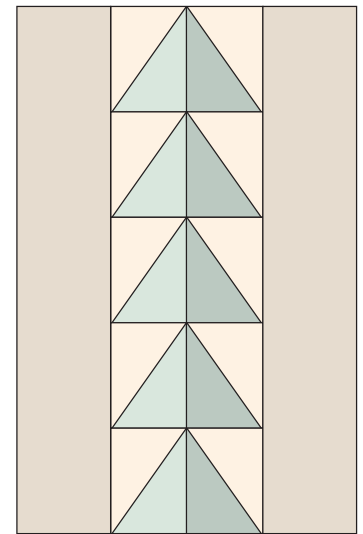
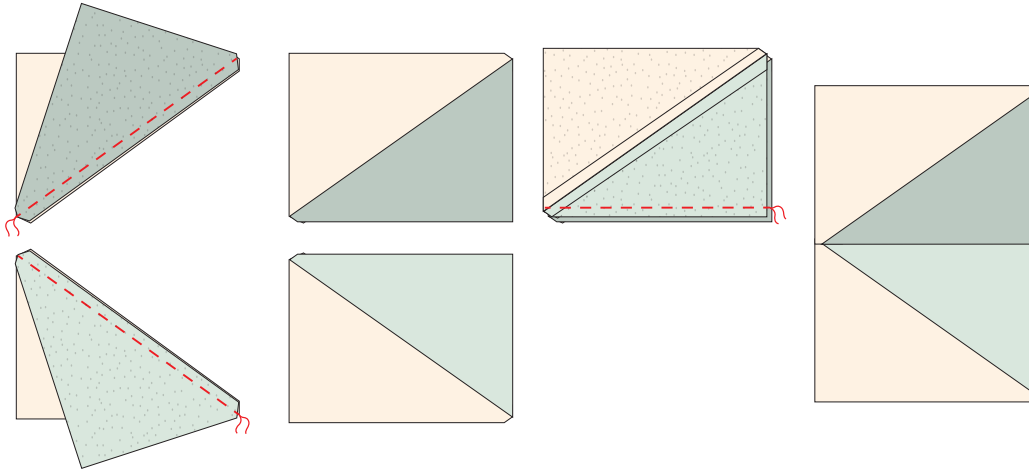
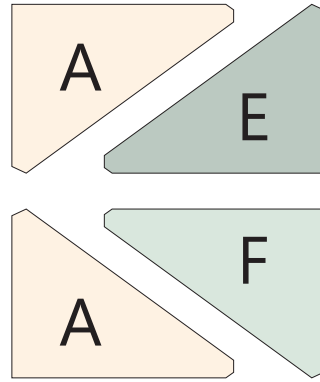
Always Use 1/4" Seams!

- Sew together using 1/4" seam allowances.
- Press seams open.
- Sew two halves.
- Sew the halves together matching center points.



Sewing the Border

- Sew piece A and F together using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.
- Sew piece A and E together.
- Sew F to E.
- Repeat for all *twenty* triangles.
- Sew 5 triangles together.
- Add a B strip to each side to make a border unit.

Be careful not to loose the point of your EF Triangle

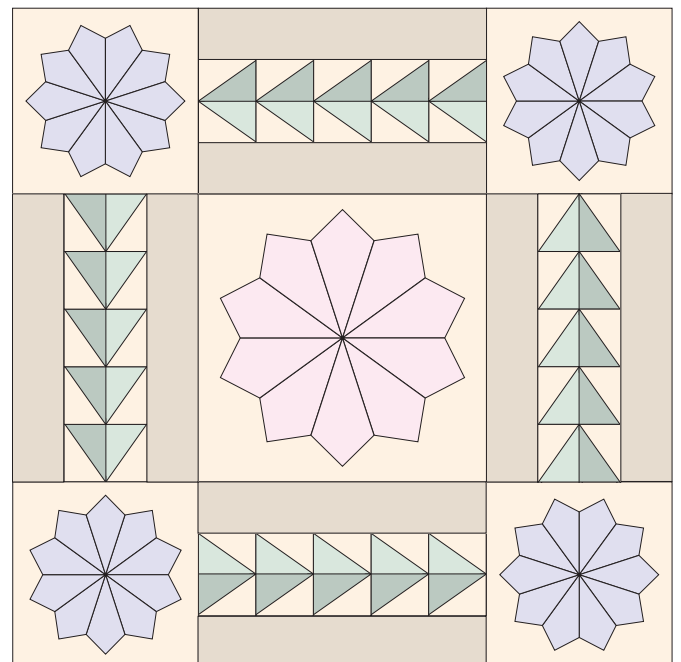
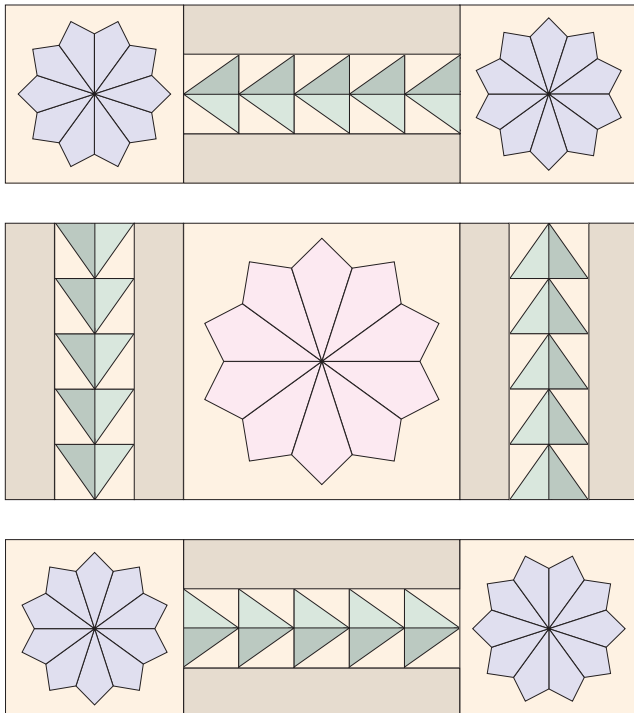
Assembly

- Applique the Large Dresden to the 23" A square.
- Applique the Small Dresdens to the 15" A squares.
- Sew the borders and dresdens together as shown.

Finish

- Layer
- Quilt
- Bind

Dresden Gem Creative Option

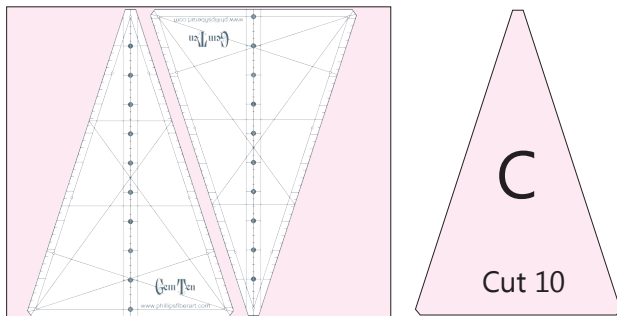

		**Two 4 ¼" x 30"
		**Three 4 ¼" x 23"
B	½ yd	Eight 4 ¼" x 13"
C	¾ yd*	Two 10 ¾" x width
D	1 ½ yd*	Five 7" x 54"

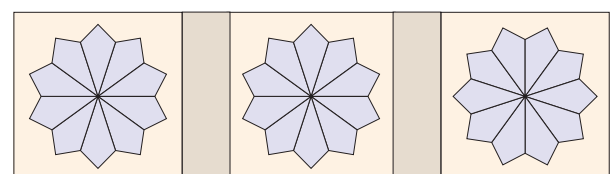
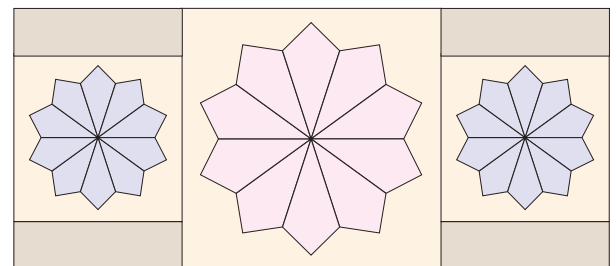
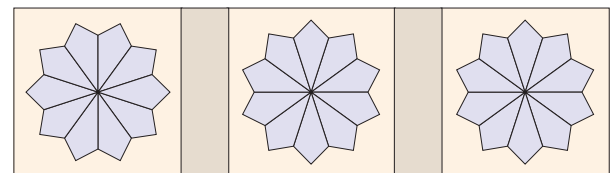
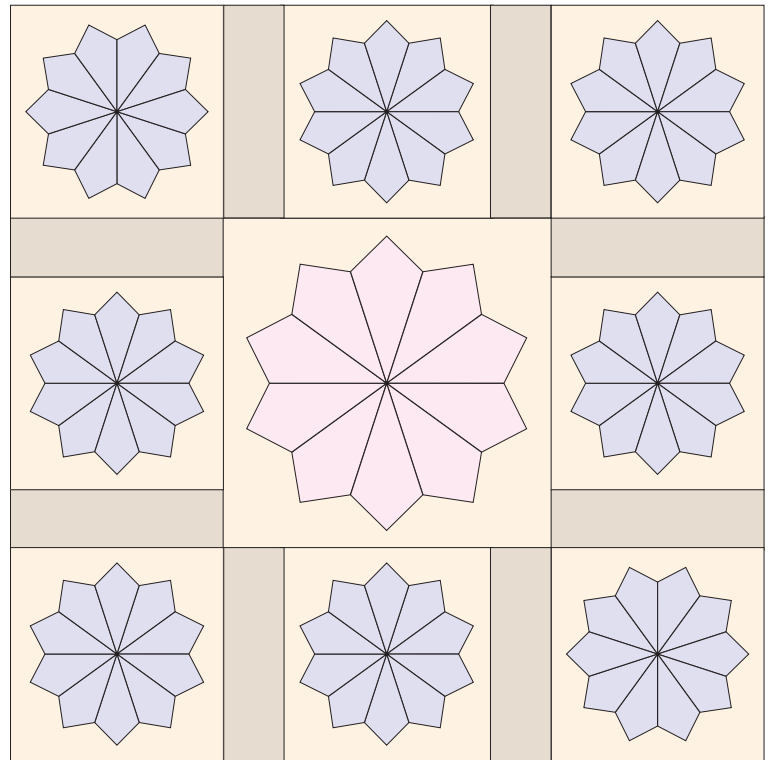
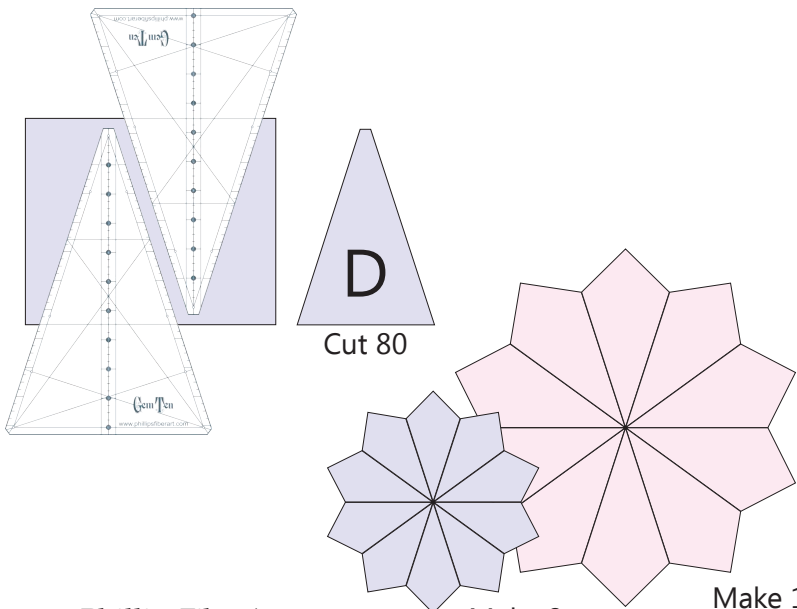

Cutting

- Cut Strips as listed.
- Cut *ten* of C using the Gem Ten tool.



- Cut *eighty* of D using the Gem Ten tool on the 6 ½" line or the full sized Gem Junior tool.



- Sew the borders and dresdens together as shown.
